

Tuscaloosa City Schools' Summer Programs

Program	Description	Location
Elementary School (759-3533)	The regular Elementary Summer School Program offers reading and mathematics for those students who need more time to master the skills as well as those who wish to keep up or stay ahead. The program features a smaller teacher-pupil ratio during the school term with opportunities for remediation or acceleration.	Skyland Elementary School
Alabama Reading First Initiative (759-3533)	This program is only for the students and staff of Alberta Elementary. The Alabama State Department of Education through the Reading First sub-grant is providing a summer reading intervention program for students attending Alberta and Northington Elementary School. Jump Start (759-3533)	JumpStart is a program designed for entering kindergarten students who have had little or no daycare experience. Students who have participated in the Tuscaloosa City Schools Pre-Kindergarten Program are not eligible to attend. JumpStart will provide entering kindergarten students the opportunity to experience 'real' school, familiarize themselves with procedures and daily routines, and develop important vocabulary which will help ready them for their public school experience. This program is also available for Spanish-speaking incoming Kindergarten students for summer 2008 only.	Alberta and Skyland Elementary Schools
Middle School (759-3722)	The Middle School Summer Program provides six weeks of academic core classes in the areas of language arts, mathematics, science and social studies for students in grades 6 - 8. This program is offered for students who need additional help in completing the curriculum requirements for promotion. The academic day is divided into two 95-minute classes.	Westlawn Middle School
Special Needs (759-3531 ext 223)	The Tuscaloosa City Schools Special Needs Summer Program curriculum will be based on each student's Individual Education Program (IEP). In addition to following the student's IEP, the students will swim four days per week and benefit from a weekly field trip in the community.	Oak Hill School
Tuscaloosa Academic Enrichment (759-3722)	The Tuscaloosa Academic Enrichment Program is a comprehensive initiative bringing together education, culture enrichment, service learning and mentoring for students on Tuscaloosa's West Side. The summer component consists of three weeks of quality academic (literacy and mathematics) and cultural programming for incoming at-risk high school freshmen (25-30) at Central High School followed by peer and college-age mentoring during the academic year for on-going academic and emotional support. Participants will return to be peer leaders and mentors to others, growing a cadre of student leaders.	Westlawn Middle School/ Central High School
High Hopes Summer Tutorials & Credit Recovery Program (759-3722)	HIGH HOPES is a summer tutorial program that provides every Alabama high school student an opportunity to pass the Alabama High School Graduation Exam (AHSGE). Tutoring will be offered in all five core academic subject-areas assesses on the AHSGE. Credit Recovery is a course-specific, skill based program for students who have not mastered specific content or skills. This program is based on deficiencies rather than a repeat of the entire course. Upon successful completion students may receive course credit or earn promotion.	Tuscaloosa Center for Technology
21st Century Program (759-3507)	The 21 st Century Program provides students with academic enrichment opportunities along with activities designed to complement the students' regular academic program. The program features a range of high-quality services to support student learning and development, including tutoring and mentoring, academic enrichment, community service opportunities, as well as music, arts, sports, and cultural activities. The Middle School Transition Program (759-3507)	The Middle School Transition Program provides five weeks of academic classes in the areas of Reading and Mathematics for rising 6 th grade students. This program also offers assistance with improving self confidence, raising self-esteem, and similar issues that middle school students may confront during their transition into middle school. The program runs Monday through Thursday of each week.	Eastwood Middle School
The ESL Summer Program (759-3507)	The ESL Summer Program is a program designed for students with a wide range of educational needs with respect to learning English as a second language. This program provides for extended learning opportunities during the summer months. Identified LEP students in the district will be served by this alternative language program. CNP Summer Feeding Program (759-3515)	The Child Nutrition Program will offer breakfast and lunch supporting the summer school programs at two sites. All feeding programs are open to the public.
